MANAGE YOUR DOG

Keeping your dog in control keeps people, other dogs and wildlife safe. Dogs must be leashed at all times on the preserve.



PICK UP POOP

Dog waste is a health hazard for people, wildlife, and plants. Please bag your pet's waste, and take it with you.

Trash Your Trash

Please pick up all trash, even biodegradable materials like food scraps, which are unsightly and attract scavengers that can harm native wildlife.

Stick To Trails

Staying on trails protects wildlife and their homes. Short-cutting trails causes erosion and damages trailside plants. Please walk on designated trails only.

No Motorized Vehicles or Mountain Bikes

Such vehicles can be destructive to plants and wildlife and disrupt the quiet experience others are here to enjoy.

Hunting and Fishing

Hunting, fishing, and trapping are not permitted. Deer hunting is by special permit only. Contact the preserve manager for permit information.

Leave It As You Find It

Please leave all plants, flowers, animals, rocks, and artifacts for all visitors to enjoy. Do not enter research areas.
