MANAGE YOUR DOG

Keeping your dog in control keeps people, other dogs, and wildlife safe. Dogs must be leashed at all times on the preserve.

PICK UP POOP

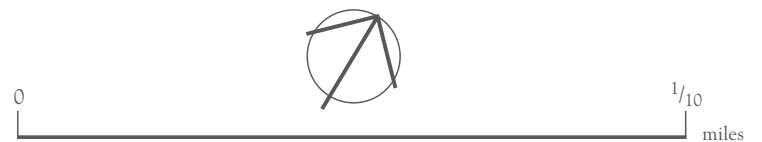
Dog waste is a health hazard. It also increases the nitrogen in the soil, making it hard for native plants to survive, and contributes to water pollution. Please use bags provided at waste station near the parking lot. Always clean up your dog's poop—wherever it's left.

TRASH YOUR TRASH

Please pick up all trash—both yours and that of others. Even biodegradable materials, such as apple cores and orange peels, take years to break down and attract scavengers that can harm native wildlife. Trash is unsightly and ruins everyone's outdoor experience.

STICK TO TRAILS

Staying on trails protects wildlife and their homes. Shortcutting trails causes erosion and damages trailside plants. Please walk and ride on designated trails only.



Leave It As You Find It

Please leave all plants, flowers, animals, rocks, and artifacts for all visitors to enjoy.

Be a Good Neighbor

There are a number of private residences within and adjoining the preserve. Please respect our neighbors' privacy.

Horseback Riding

Horseback riding is permitted on designated trails under good conditions. Please ride to and from the preserve. We cannot accommodate horse trailers.
