







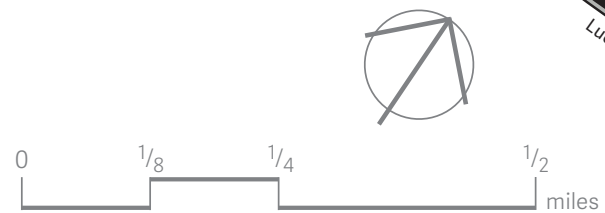



MAP KEY

leashes required

Pets are permitted, but must be leashed at all times to keep people, other pets, and wildlife safe. No exceptions. Violators may be asked to leave the preserve.

pick up poop

Dog waste is a health hazard for people, wildlife, and plants. Please bag your pet's waste, and take it with you. Please come prepared with your own waste bags

stick to trails

Please stay on designated trails to protect fragile plants, prevent erosion or wildlife disturbance, and reduce the chance of tick-borne illnesses. Please stay out of creeks, ponds, and wetlands. Swimming is not permitted.

horseback riding

Horseback riding is permitted on designated trails under good conditions. Please ride to and from the preserve. We cannot accommodate horse trailers.

hunting

Hunting and trapping are not permitted. Deer hunting is by special permit only. Visit natlands.org/hunting for permit information.

be a good neighbor

Please respect the privacy of those who live on and adjacent to the preserve.

keep aquatic habitats healthy

To avoid disturbing aquatic plants and wildlife and prevent erosion, please stay out of wetlands, creeks, and ponds. Swimming is prohibited.

foot traffic only

No motorized vehicles or mountain bikes.

photography

Amateur photographers are welcome to take photos or videos (tag them with #NatLands!). We do, however, have restrictions and guidelines for professionals wishing to use the preserve. Visit natlands.org/beforeyouvisit for more information.
