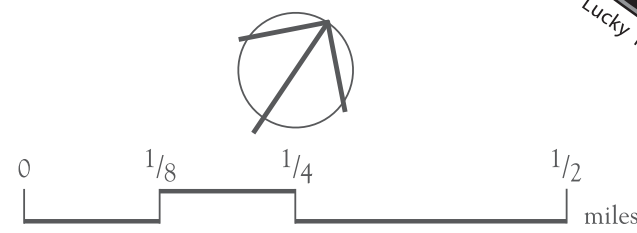
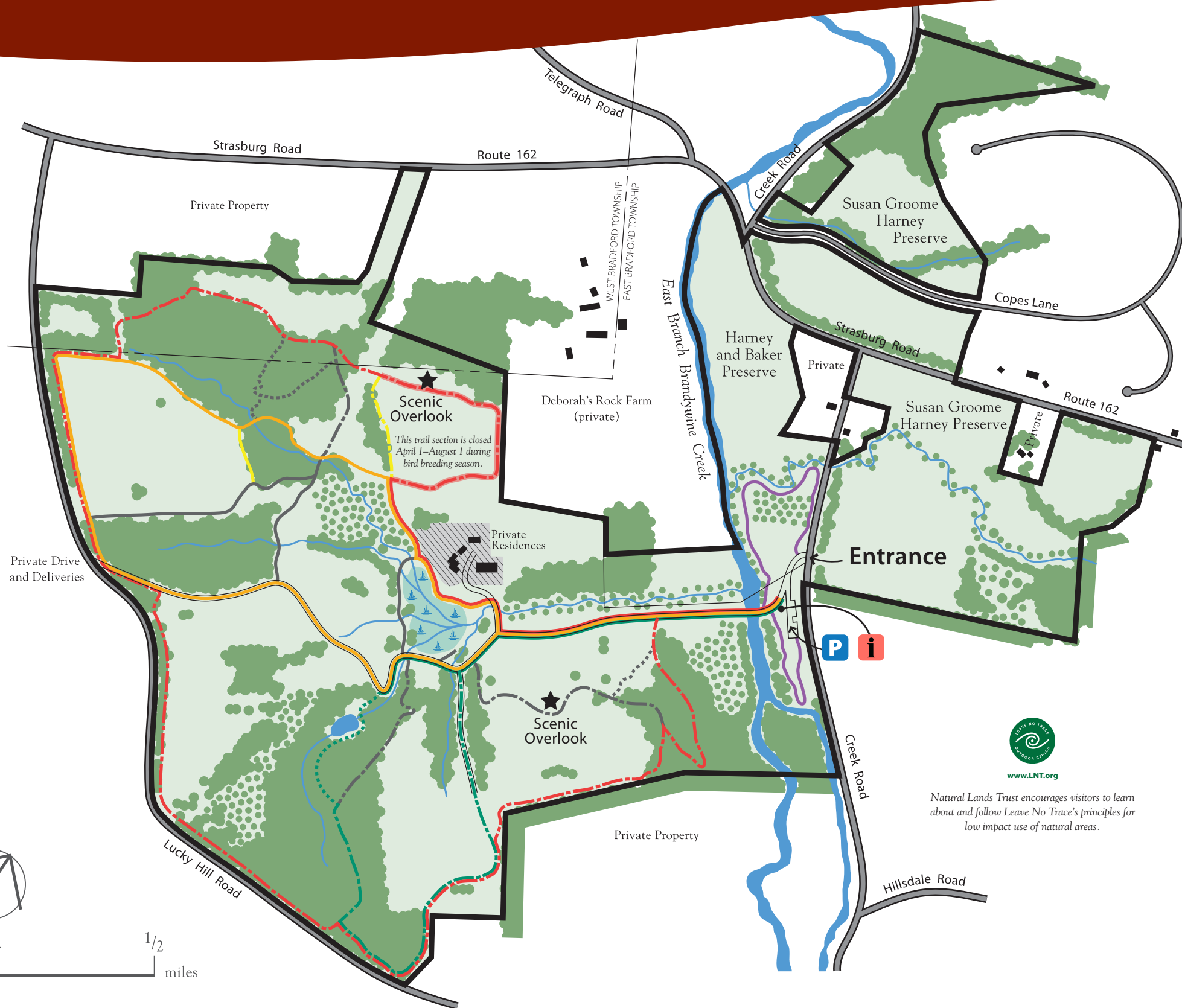

MANAGE YOUR DOG

Keeping your dog in control keeps people, other dogs and wildlife safe. Dogs must be leashed at all times on the preserve.



PICK UP POOP

Dog poop is a health hazard. It also increases the nitrogen in the soil, making it hard for native plants to survive, and contributes to water pollution. Please pack a pick-up bag and always clean up your dog's poop—wherever it's left.

STICK TO TRAILS

Staying on trails protects wildlife and their homes. Short-cutting trails causes erosion and damages trailside plants. Please walk and ride on designated trails only.

HORSEBACK RIDING

Horseback riding is permitted on designated trails under good conditions. Please ride to and from the preserve. We cannot accommodate horse trailers.



Hunting

Hunting and trapping are not permitted. Deer hunting is by special permit only. Contact the preserve manager for permit information.

Be a Good Neighbor

There are a number of private residences within and adjoining the preserve. Please respect our neighbors' privacy.

Keep Aquatic Habitats Healthy

To avoid disturbing aquatic plants and wildlife and prevent erosion, please stay out of wetlands, creeks, and ponds. Swimming is prohibited.
